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Minutes from the 2011 SARG AGM – held 28th April at St John, Bramford

Welcome and Introductions:-

Dave – G8XOR opened the meeting at 7:30pm and welcomed everybody and went through the domestic arrangements for the building.

This was a return to this fine venue to which we are very grateful to St John for the facilities. All present agreed that this would be a suitable location for future meetings.

Minutes and Matters arising from the last meeting held 23rd April 2010:-

The minutes of last years meeting were circulated at the meeting. As there were no corrections or amendments, these were duly accepted as a true record of events.

This would give us the opportunity to get some positive PR for free and even get someone on Lesley's show in the afternoon? - SARG to follow this up.

AP02/10 G1YFF to continue working on GB3EA – specifically to conduct tests with 1750Hz tone access later this year

Jake reported that he had investigated this and a fair amount of work would be involved to achieve this, but as there didn't seem to be a huge amount of interest, this action will now be closed.

AP03/10 SARG to confirm with G0TMX that he is happy to remain as the Representative for the Western Area

This was done, but we need to re-confirm again for this year.

AP04/10 All to make more use of our repeaters and respond anyone calling through.

Use them or loose them!

Action is closed, but should remain as something we all need to do. Please use the repeaters and make our efforts worthwhile.

AP05/10 SARG to investigate Audio Streaming of initially GB3PO and then perhaps the other repeaters to our web site

AP06/10 SARG to investigate RF Linking of GB3EF and GB3IH and to at least have a feasibility study by the next AGM

The above two actions will remain ongoing but be combined into a single new action. G7DNT will be the Technical Lead along with the SARG Committee to achieve this

AP07/10 G6PDE to continue with outstanding work on GB3IT as per the last minutes.

Chris reported back that unfortunately, no progress had been made with obtaining the permission to use the license. This action will continue with an additional action for Steve M1ACB to try and make some enquiries with his RSGB hat on.

AP08/10 G8VZZ to sell the TS60 by the best means possible for SARG funds.

Action closed – see Treasurer's Report

AP09/10 G8XOR to find a suitable gift for Alan G8CJL

Still ongoing, but the SARG have decided that a signed copy of "The Hidden History of Orford Ness" would make a nice gift.

Chairman's Report:-

This has been another successful year for the Group with all the repeaters working, if not to their full license conditions in terms of output power. GB3PO has been working on reduced power for some months due to the failure of the main transmitter. It was felt that time was better utilised in completing the build of the replacement repeater than repairing the old unit.

After one false start the new repeater based on Tait equipment was installed in the rack in the Ipswich Hospital plant room on Sunday 24/04/2011.

Initial reports appear to be favourable with good through audio and the "pips" adjusted to more acceptable level.

I am sure that there will be further comments as to minor adjustments that could be made to improve the operation of the unit. However it is not a clone of the old "PO" and the pitch of the tones and the feel of the repeater have change to some extent due to the use of a different control system. I feel that users will soon become accustomed to the new unique feel.

At this point I must extent my very sincere thanks to Jake G1YFF for all the time he has spent guiding me through the build and completing the software and hardware for the new control board. Without his help and support we would still be using the old equipment.

We are always open to comments from users on how we can improve the repeaters so if you have any thoughts on minor adjustments that need to be made please let one of the committee members know. One I have is that the time taken to receive an acknowledgement "pip" needs to be reduced.

As and when time allows further work is envisaged to improve the aerial filtering as the new unit has better isolation than the previous equipment.

May I extend my thanks to all who have supported the Group over the past year especially Keith G7CIY, Keith G0FEA and Juliet G7RVS who have worked in the background to keep the paperwork, Website and finances up to date.

Grateful thanks to those who have made contributions of time, money or equipment to support the projects so far. Our site rentals are very low and we are very fortunate that the site owners see this as supporting technology in the wider community but we still need financial support to continue to keep the repeaters managed by the Group running.

The next project being considered is an upgrade of GB3IH to Tait equipment. We have most of the hardware and the experience of building GB3PO. The project may start towards the end of the year and will mean that all repeaters will then be based on Tait equipment.

Finally, my thanks to St. John Ambulance Suffolk for providing the venue for the meeting tonight.

The original version had several areas which could be misleading and have the potential to cause the Group difficulties. After some good discussion and some minor wording changes which were agreed at the meeting, it was voted on and carried unanimously that SARG will adopt the new Constitution. The updated version will be available to view from our Web Site by the time the minutes are published.

Repeater News and Updates:

G1YFF took the floor and gave some updates on all the repeaters that we maintain: as per the Chairman's Report, the main big news is of course the installation of the new GB3PO. Feedback on its operation, coverage and reception reports is welcomed to any member of the Committee.

GB3EA still has some performance issues and we propose to change its aerial at the Wickhambrook site. Some tweaks to the firmware and logic may also take place at some point during the year.

Much work has been done on GB3PO to get to where we are today although there may yet be some further improvements that can be made. We now have a full set of drawings completed.

Steve – M1ACB asked what the SARG's views were on D-Star. Jake explained that it would be very expensive to initiate but we were not totally against it if there was sufficient interest. Those present at the meeting said that they preferred to keep things the way they were.
